Divorce Act Amendments: Highlights to your Practice (Apr. 23, 2019)

This webinar will offer an overview of one of the most extensive overhauls of the Divorce Act since its implementation in 1985. Participants will be provided with a summary of key changes and new approaches to family law in the wake of this major legislative amendment.

Areas to be covered include the new relocation provisions in the Act (along with a discussion of the impact of similar guidelines in British Columbia), parenting terminology and new factors which must be considered in the determination of best interests of the child and the treatment of family violence in the Act.

We will also cover provisions to make the family law justice system more accessible and efficient, including ways to address inadequate disclosure through changes to the Family Orders and Agreements Enforcement Assistance Act, new ISO processes for Divorce Act matters, and the long term goal to ratify the 2007 Hague Child Support Convention.

Income for Tax Purposes: What Corporate Lawyers Need to Know (Mar. 6, 2018)

Joint Ownership: Legal Developments and Best Practices (Oct. 11, 2018)

Joint ownership is one of the most common ways for Canadians to hold title to their most valuable assets. At the same time, many joint owners don't appreciate the potential risks associated with making an asset jointly-owned. The administrative and tax benefits may be offset by such risks, and situations involving incapacity and undue influence can create a dynamic for the abuse of joint ownership.

Lawyers need to know when to use joint ownership to avoid probate, when it is best to have sole ownership, and the benefits, problems and alternatives to joint ownership.

This webinar will offer best ethical practices when advising on joint ownership and documenting intentions. You will learn about banking practices when clients change accounts to joint ownership, and new products that might address some of the problems when clients want assets to be joint.
